

Note to all Proffered Abstract Authors

Authors submitting a paper do so on the understanding that the work has not been published before, is not being considered for publication elsewhere. The submission of the manuscript by the authors means that the authors automatically agree to assign exclusive copyright to the Dokuz Eylul University if the manuscript is accepted for publication.

The work shall not be published elsewhere in any language without the written consent of the publisher. No material may be stored on microfilm or CD or in electronic databases and the like or reproduced photographically without the prior written consent of the Dokuz Eylul University.

Congress fee does not cover the postage and cost of the Congress Proceedings Book(s) which can be purchased afterwards.

The Style and Formatting for the Book of “The International Multidisciplinary Women’s Congress”

- The manuscripts should be typed in MS Word (2003), in Times New Roman, font-size 10, and single-spaced, and should not exceed 15 pages (including abstract and references).
- The left margin should be 2,0 cm; the right, top, and bottom margins should be 1,5 cm
- Title: capital letters, bold, font size 12, centered
- After the title two spaces should be left and author(s) names and institutions should be written.
- Author(s) Names: The author’s/authors’ first name and surname should be typed in lowercase with the initials capitalized in font-size 12 and centered.
- After the author names one space should be left.
- Institution Name(s): Should be typed in lowercase with the initials capitalized; should be centered, typed in italics in font-size 12.
- Institution name should be written in the following order: University/Institution name, Faculty name, Department name, City name, Country name.
- Email(s) should be centered, typed in font-size 12, and underlined. It should be written without leaving a space after the institution name.
- “Abstract” heading should be placed two lines down after the emails. It should be typed in bold, in font-size 11 and in lowercase with the initial capitalized.
- The abstract should contain a maximum of 300 words, should outline main topics and should be typed in font-size 11, in italics and justified margins.
- An English abstract should also be included for Turkish and German papers.
- “Keywords” heading should be placed one line after the abstract. It should be typed in bold and in font-size 11.
- 5 keywords should be provided .
- Text should start with the “Introduction” on the second page, and divided into appropriate sections. Final section must be “Conclusion(s)”. References and, if any Acknowledgements and Appendices must follow this section.
- (Sub)headings should be typed in lowercase with the first letter of each word capitalized, aligned to left, in font-size 11, in bold.
- Photographs and other illustrations can be submitted in TIF (300 dpi minimum). Illustrations should be suitable for publication without further treatment. Statistical data should, if possible, be presented in the form of charts or diagrams, rather than tables.
- Citations to other publications should be made in the text by using surname of the author, year of publication and page number as (Author, 2001: 54). For publications with two authors, surnames of both authors should be used as (Author1 and Author2, 2003: 87). Publications having more than two authors should be cited by giving only the surname of the first author as (Author1 et al., 2005: 34).

- Cited publications should be sorted alphabetically in the list of “References” according to the surnames of the first authors. To sort publications with the same first author, the surname of the second and following authors should be used. Publications with the same authors should be sorted according to their publication years from old to new. Publications which have all same authors and publication years should be distinguished in the text by using lower case letters such as (2001a) and (2001b). Publications having three or more authors and same years should be distinguished in the same manner. Surnames and initials of all authors must appear in the References. Unpublished works may also be included in the References, if necessary. References should be written according to the following examples:

1. Journal article

2. Book

Wheeler, J.L. (1946) **Progress and problems in education for librarianship**. New York: Carnegie, 59.

3. Chapter in book

Saviger, P. (1978) “International Relations and the Philosophy of History”, M. Donelan (ed.) **The Reason of States: A Study in International Political Theory**. London: Allen, 15-17.

4. WEB Site
